Visas: If you don't have a British passport, you will need a visa to work in the UK

- Youth Mobility Scheme Visa 2-3 years (18-35 year olds)
- UK Ancestry Visa 5 years (if you have a grandparent born in the UK)
- Skilled Worker Visa 3-5 years (if you have a job offer from a UK employer)
